


## PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE 20 APRIL 2020

Recent guidance from Highland Council suggested that tasks be set fortnightly. Please tick the option that best suits your circumstances.



As a result of your responses, we are moving to both a weekly grid next week and a daily task from class teachers. On Monday, Wednesday and Friday there will be a literacy task and on Tuesday and Thursday a mathematical task in your child's google classroom. Daily tasks will be available from 8 a.m. along with the register as we are aware that some children only have access to a shared machine and that parents have to work online during the normal working day. Please be assured that our staff are also facing the same challenges and that whilst Highland Council is doing all it can to enable capacity, there are staff too who are working from home, many on their own home machines with Wifi which doesn't always connect.

Recent guidance from Highland Council suggested tasks are set according to Curriculum for Excellence levels - early, first and second. Please tick the option you would prefer.

We want to ensure that when we are setting tasks, we are aware that children should not be spending too long each day working at a screen. Please tick the option you would prefer.



Would you be interested in tasks which make use of online and television learning, e.g. bitesize on BBC.



Which day would you find it most useful to receive the weekly update?


